# Issues relating to new student Registration process

Privacy Concerns

- → CIS is now a stand alone Association. They are no longer part of AIS.
- → The new CIS Constitution states that Associations ie. CSSA, AICES etc are no longer members of CIS. Individual schools are now the members. Therefore CSSA as an association has limited influence when decisions are being made. It is up to member schools to communicate directly with CIS if they have any questions or concerns.

  Please cc Linda and Amanda into any email so they are aware of what issues are being raised & can also raise them at CIS Committee meetings.
- → Each school needs to have completed & upload the CIS Membership form via the new CIS website: https://www.cis.nsw.edu.au/registration/
- → Schools have expressed concerns over data privacy issues ie. amount of information required to submit a student for a trial. Why does CIS require so much information on students who are attending trials? This data is stored by Revolutionise. How secure is it?

- → At this stage there is no option for checking nominations. After you have completed a student nomination an invoice number is shown on the screen. Please record or take a screen shot of the Invoice Number as proof the nomination has been submitted.
- → Ensure you keep records and a paper trail to cover yourself in case of potential issues with registrations.
- → When you nominate a student to trial you must include a parent/guardian email address.

  Underneath this field is an **Additional Email Address** field. If you put your school email address in this field you should receive a copy of the email sent to parents.
- → The link sent to parents only lasts 24hrs. At this stage there is no way CIS can resend the link.
- → Once you have registered as a teacher you cannot change your status. To register as a convenor/coach/team manager etc you need to create a new profile ie. have multiple logins.

#### **Executive Officer's AGM Report**

The Christian Schools Sports Association was formed 30 years ago to foster Christian thought and practice through sporting events within and between Christian Schools. The Association is responsible for organising major State Carnivals and Gala Days which are an integral part of each school's PE Programme and to develop and promote appropriate policies, rules and guidelines based on Christian principles. Over the past 30 years the Association has grown to 79 member schools with new school enquiries each year.

The CSSA Committee of Management faced a number of challenges in 2018 one of which was to find a replacement for Neil Wescombe who retired after 11 years of service. With the increasing demand and complexity of the Treasurer's position it was decided that we look to outside assistance and employ a company who specialises in this area of work. In March we entered into an agreement with Resolve Consulting Accountants.

Resolve deliver customised professional solutions across Australia and internationally to schools, churches and non-profit organisations providing high quality, cost effective solutions in the area of Governance, strategic leadership and financial management.

Resolve have streamlined our accounts and our bookkeeping & payroll operations now run through Xero, a cloud-based accounting software platform. We are in the final set-up stage and through End of Month check lists and detailed Monthly Reports we are confident this area of operation is in a strong position.

The Committee of Management have also established sub-committee groups in 3 focus areas:

Sub Committee 1 Human Resources - employment reviews, contracts, job

descriptions, recruitment, long service leave etc

Sub Committee 2 Policies; update and write necessary policies for CSSA

ie. Child protection, privacy, gender equity etc.

Sub Committee 3 Finances - CSSA Fees, CIS Fees, Yearly budget, Bookkeeping, Resolve

These sub-committees allow us to focus on areas of expertise within the COM and allow us to be proactive in our meetings. If you feel that you can contribute to any of these areas I encourage you to consider becoming a member of the CSSA Committee of Management as we have a number of vacancies to fill this year. Thank you to the current committee members and in particular Daniel Nixon: Vice President and Warren Melville: Principal Rep who are stepping down.

Each year I like to thank a number of people who have worked tirelessly for the Association. One such person is my trusty off-sider Amanda Butterworth. Amanda only works 2 days per week but you would be mistaken to think she works full time. Amanda is a great asset to our Association and an amazing support to me.

Finally thank you to our dedicated State Convenors, Coaches and CSSA Officials. You are the back bone of the Association and your hard work does not go unnoticed - we appreciate all that you do.
