### Report on the financial report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Christian Schools Sports Association Inc., which comprises the balance sheet as at 31 December 2020, and the income statement, statement of changes in equity/statement of recognised income and expenses for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the Members declaration.

# The responsibility of the Management Committee for the financial report

The Committee of the Association of the entity are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements which form part of the financial report are appropriate to meet the financial reporting requirements of the constitution and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The Management Committee's responsibility also includes establishing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

#### Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, as described in Note 1, are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian auditing standards. #### Independence

#### Matters Arising

Segregation of duties is inadequate due to limited staff. This results in a number of incompatible duties being performed by the one staff member.

Stock control and valuation is inadequate. This is due to the location of stock at various locations not being under the direct control of the entity.

#### Auditor's opinion

In our opinion, the financial report, in all material respects, gives a true and fair view of the financial position of Christian Schools Sports Association Inc as of 31 December 2021 and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements.
